A. OBJECTIVES of State SVEEP Plan

1. To improve the overall turnout in the State to 70% (from the 58.81% in 2009 LS elections)
2. To increase voter turnout in the target low turnout polling stations.
3. To focus on the ACs with low EP ratio and carryout registration drive.
4. To focus on the ACs with low polling percentage for high motivation campaign to achieve optimum increase in voter turnout.
5. To bridge gender gap in enrolment and turnout.
6. Increase in postal ballot voting by educating and facilitating service voters and employees on election duty.
7. To bring about visible improvement in the quality of electoral participation in terms of informed and ethical voting.

1. Karnataka

Formerly known as the State of Mysore, the state of Karnataka is located in the southern part of India and has the states of Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala and Goa as neighbors. The capital of the state is the city of Bangalore which has evolved as one of the most vibrant and one of the fastest growing cities in the country. The state of Karnataka was formed in 1956 as the State of Mysore and was renamed as Karnataka in 1973.

Assembly Constituencies

Every Electoral Registration Officer will be asked to do part-wise analysis of electoral registration as well as voting percentages so that weak areas can be identified.
